Position description:

The Institute of Parasitology (IoP) at McGill University (<http://www.mcgill.ca/parasitology/>) seeks to appoint a tenure-track Assistant Professor with expertise in **Parasite Immunology**. The appointee will hold a Ph.D. or equivalent with a demonstrated record of research success in the broad area of **immunology of parasitic infections of human or veterinary importance** and with potential for excellence in teaching. Applicants with a history of excellent publications, a record of grant success, and research on new or emerging zoonotic protozoan or helminth diseases are especially encouraged to apply. The appointee will develop a strong research program supported by external funds and participate in undergraduate and graduate teaching at McGill within the Faculty of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (<http://www.mcgill.ca/macdonald/>). Broad research themes at the IoP include analysis of host-parasite interactions from immunological, nutritional, and biochemical perspectives (including vaccine development and development of antigen-based diagnostic assays); drug discovery and development; analysis of the mechanisms of antiparasitic drug resistance; neurobiology and neuropharmacology of helminths; and basic cell and molecular biology of parasites. The IoP is a diverse and highly collaborative community with diversity, equity, and inclusion at the core of its mission. McGill University is an English language institution functioning in a bilingual environment.
